Building a Tower

JR3KQJ

I finished building up my third tower.

The first one was built up when I was in my twenties, which had a tri-bander on its 16meters top.

The second one is a 18mh tower. It had been by my working office. When the office moved, I removed the tower to my house. A five bands tri-bander is on its top, which is my main antenna.

The third one was from my local station who quitted the radio. It is 20mh one and a WARC bands tri-bander is on the top. It was a very hard work to build it up but it was a great joy that a very weak signal with my rotary dipole changes into 559 level with the beam antenna.
