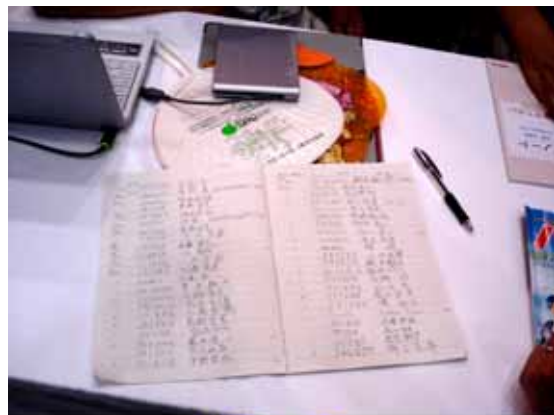

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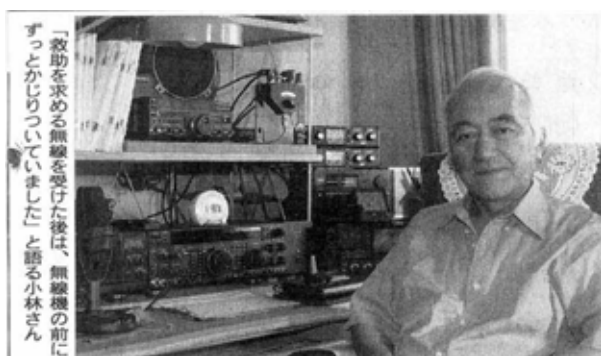
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## JA8LN caught SOS!

Soon he listened to the frequency and found the SOS. He soon called the police station and encouraged the climber. Thanks to his effort, the climber (who had broken six ribs) was soon rescued and sent to a hospital by helicopter.

### 山の遭難者救助、お手柄のアマ無線

日高山系エオオノトツタベツ岳(一、九〇二)で六月三十日に起きた遭難事故で、帯広をとの救助を求める無線を受信した。けがの状況や場所を林良治さん(帯広)が遭難者から救助を求める無線を受信し、帯広に通報した。迅速対応が、翌日の遭難救助につながった。小林さんは「当然のことをしたまで」と謙虚に語っている。

事故は、単独登山に来ていた岩見沢の男性(一)が同日早朝、標高千六百メートルの「北東カール」で、残雪に巨岩を取られて滑落、肋骨を折る重傷を負って動けなくなった。

小林さんは同日午前九時頃、アマチュア無線仲間から「救助を求めている人がいるようだ」との電話を受けた。急いで無線機の前で待機すると、救助を求めている人がいたら、警察に連絡した。けがの状況や場所を林良治さん(帯広)が遭難者から救助を求める無線を受信し、帯広に通報した。迅速対応が、翌日の遭難救助につながった。小林さんは「当然のことをしたまで」と謙虚に語っている。

「日高山系を守る会の安住幸紀代表にまで、北東カール付近は急こう配で、例年七月いっぱいまで雪が残るといって、帯広方向に眺望が開けているため、無線や携帯電話が通じやすい。小林さんは救助を求める無線を受けた後も、寒さに震える遭難者を無線で何度も励まし続けました。小林さんは「助かって本当によかった」と話している。(中野訓)

**JA3ATJ:** Thanks to those who helped, KCJ in Ham Fair was a great success. I hope new members will come to join us.

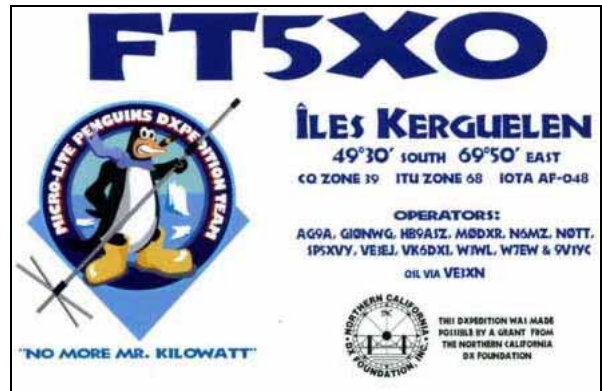
