Inquiring for KCJ members in disaster region

JR3KQJ Nakashima, KCJ president

I sent e-mail or called in order to inquire about safties of KCJ members in seven area. As of Apr. 5, I fortunately was able to get in touch with all the KCJ members there.

E-mail from seven land members

Haru JN7MLJ: I live Matsushima town in Miyagi prefecture. I appreciate consolatory and inquiring e-mail about my safty. Even though my place was located on the coast, damage was not much compared with those in neighboring towns/villages. Evacuation instruction was cancelled at Mar 15 and electric power returned on the night of Mar 16. Then I could use PC. It was fortunate that my antenna was not broken and my transceiver had no damage. I heard that Ishinomaki city got extensive damage, so I am worrying about KCJ members there. I am expecting that retrieving normal life would take long time.

Tom JA7AEM in Ishinomaki city: Very thank you for concerning about us. I am now staying at my relative's place. Just after the earthquake, my family and an old neighbor evacuated together by my car. This was a right decision. If we had been late about 15 minutes, tsunami would claim our lives. Because sea water did not recede even three days after tsunami, I went to my house for checking it out by a boat of Self-Defense Forces. The inundation above the floor level was about 1.2 meters in depth, so the first floor was completely destroyed. My shack was on the second floor, but all the rigs fell on the floor. I cannot tell when infrastructure will be resumed. Even if it would be recovered, living here again would take long time. I feel I am fortunate in spite of havoc because I am alive. Today, at last, the system of cellular phone retrieved and this is my first report to KCJ.

Ham festival in Kagawa prefecture

KCJ members, Mr. Fujiwara JA5OSA and Mr. Ogose JA5CUX, participated in Ham festival held by JARL Kagawa branch on Mar. 13 and displayed keys and KCJ bulletins "The KEY". Both tried to get participants interested in CW. It is surprising that some participants came from far-off places such as Yokohama and Hiroshima.

Sporadic E propagation all over Japan happened in the morning of May 21 and continued. I heard that stations in Shanghai were heard in JA1 area. When I got this information I was not sure if I could work them or not because the propagation on VHF bands depends on positions of both ends. It was lucky for me to catch their signals with S5 or more. I called and got immediate reply from one of them. This was my first BY on 2 m band. Sweeping the band, I found other Shanghai stations at every 10 kHz. I called and worked one station after another. Worked six stations in total on SSB mode. All of them were in Chinese four area near Shanghai and their operators were seemed to be used to work DX, so contacts were made smoothly. Looking for CW station, I found one and worked. I was excited after long time separation.

- 1. Name of Contest: The 32nd KCJ Contest
- 2. Period: Starts 1200z Aug. 20, 2011. Ends 1200z Aug. 21, 2011.
- 3. Mode: CW.
- 4. Categories Participants in Japan(JA): Single Operator—Multi-band and
 —Single band, Multi Operator and SWL—Multi-band.

Those in overseas(DX) and SWL: Multi-band.

5. Bands: 1.8 through 50Mhz, except WARC bands.

Suggested frequencies:

1810-1825 and 1907.5-1912.5 kHz, 3510-3525kHz, 7010-7030kHz, 14050-14080kHz, 21050-21080kHz, 28050-28080kHz, 50.050-50.090MHz

- 6. Exchange JA: RST plus Prefecture/district code. DX: RST plus Continent code (See the reference of this document).
- 7. Invalid contacts:
 - a. On cross-mode or not CW.
 - b. By cross-band, via repeater or satellite.
- 8. Points: For each complete contact on each band,
 - JA: One point with JA, five points with DX.
 - DX: One point with JA, no point with others.
- 10. Multipliers: Each prefecture/district (and continent for JA) worked on each band.
- 11. Scoring: Multiplying total points by total multipliers
- 12. Log instructions:
 - a. Each entry must be accompanied by summary sheet showing all scoring information, name and address of the participant in BLOCK LETTERS.
 - b. Log should contain date, time, band, call-sign and exchanges both sent and received.
 - c. The time must be logged in JST by JA, and in UTC by DX.
 - d. Files in Cabrillo format may be emailed directly to address described below. Be sure to put your call-sign in the subject line of your e-mail.
- 13. Awards: All logs will be collated with each other to obtain the final score, multiplying total points confirmed by total multipliers confirmed, and certificates will be awarded to:
 - a. JA: The upper 5% and the top in each prefecture/district, being ranked at the upper half of each category.
 - b. DX: The top in each DXCC entity, getting more than ten points.
- 14. Mailing deadline: The log and the summary sheet must be uploaded or postmarked by air mail no later than 21st of September, 2011.
