


Hamfair 2011


History of the number of KCJ members and its structure

Revised the history of the member of KCJ and its age structure and show here. Blue bars represent the number of admission and yellow bars that of withdrawal referred to the scale on the left hand side. The change of number of members are expressed by line with



the scale on the right hand side.

The graph below shows the age structure of members. The average age is 61.2. It was 56.6 at 2004. These data mean new entrants are not many.
