It is exactly a pleasure to welcome friends from far away.

This is the 2nd part of "FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 Visit to QARS: Qatar Amateur Radio Society" written on KCJ NEWSLETTER of December 2022.

Regarding Ham Fair 2023 held in August in Japan, its videos have been burst out releasing. As a member of the organizer, I felt it was a very bright and open Ham Fair. I was able to participate in this ham fair as a player, and able to introduce a VIP from QARS: Qatar Amateur Radio Society, who supported me when I operated A722FWC, the commemorative event station of FIFA World Cup last November. And I also introduced a friend from ARRL who operated A722FWC together. My long-standing dream to introduce both at Ham Fair in Japan was finally realized. I would like to write about my extremely fortunate story for you, including behind the scenes.

1 Prologue

In November 2022, I stayed in the capital Doha as a supporter of the Japanese National Team of Football during FIFA World Cup in Qatar, and became an eyewitness and on-site witness to the triumphs over Germany and Spain. At the same time, it was the days of operating A722FWC at QARS. Without wearing a mask, the days continued like a dream.



2 A75GM Mr. Kumar

I must thank many people for my A722FWC operation. A good news came from JR2SCJ Harada-san who always helped me at various contests. "<u>Qatar World Cup –</u> <u>S.E.S.</u>" I had an epiphany that I should visit QARS as W3FO, an Amateur Extra and be allowed to operate the event station as a guest operator.

As a Volunteer Examiner of ARRL VEC Tokyo/Yokohama VE Teams, I have been the examiner in more than 40 sessions. Because of this connection, I asked AB1FM Ms. Maria Somma, who is in charge of ARRL VEC, to contact QARS from the department in charge. Shortly after, I received an email from QARS saying, "We would like to welcome you as a guest operator."

The day after arriving at Doha, I visited QARS. The person who welcomed me was A75GM Jogesh Dewan "Kumar", engineer and chief manager in charge of communications, who was very helpful to me during my stay in Doha as the head of operations.

3 A722FWC

Normally, QARS uses its wonderful callsign <u>A71A</u>, but for the World Cup Commemorative Station, we used the call sign A722FWC: Qatar Prefix A7, 22: 2022, FWC: FIFA World Cup. Since it was in the Middle East, the main QSO target is the EU, beaming toward the northwest. For SSB, I used my real voice and I proudly operated CW by the Bencher Paddle with the split frequency operation.

Thanks to Doha's unique geographical advantage, there are eight stadiums in the vicinity of Doha, all of which are accessible via the Doha Metro. QARS is also just a few minutes' walk from the nearest Doha Metro station, and the daily accesses from my hotel located in the city center \Rightarrow QARS \Rightarrow the stadium \Rightarrow the hotel were all by subway.

4 <u>WOTT</u> Eric

From JA, I was the only one that operated A722FWC while being a supporter of the Japan National soccer Team of Football, Samurai Blue. Since it is the festival of football, the most popular sport in the world, I did believe that there would be someone else like me. He was from the US: W0TT Mr. Eric Zust, an Honor Roll of DXCC and Assistant Midwest Division Director. I successfully gained my friends who operate A722FWC together at QARS.



5 A75GM Kumar's Visit to Japan?!

During my stay in Qatar, A75GM Kumar often said to me "I might go to Ham Fair 2023 in Japan next year." In response to this, in February of this year, I sent an email with the information URL for the Ham Fair, and in April, I emailed him stating JARL's intention, which I confirmed by contacting the JARL International Section, "JARL would like to welcome Mr. Kumar to the Ham Fair 2023."

In June, I finally received an email from Kumar, saying. "I participated in the Dayton Hamvention. I am planning to take part in German Ham Radio. I would like to go to the Ham Fair in Japan, so I would like an invitation letter to arrange my visa." Upon receiving this, I replied to him to ask JARL for the invitation, and Kumar visited JARL's booth at Ham Radio in Germany and explained the purpose of his visit.

In his case, Kumar's home country India is not one of <u>the visa-exempt countries</u> set by Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, so he applied for a visa at the Japanese Embassy in Qatar. As he received the JARL's invitation letter, things went very smoothly. In July, I received a thank-you email saying that he had received an entry visa for Japan.

When I heard that my benefactor in Qatar would attend Ham Fair 2023 in Japan, it was inevitable for me to appeal my dreamlike days at World Cup. I proposed a plan to make a presentation at the annual event corner to Kumar, and he readily agreed to my plan. However, JARL International Section politely declined to my plan, saying "Unfortunately, we have already filled all slots of the event corner." I seriously worried that if I didn't find a place to greet JA hams for him, that would make it impossible for him to save face.

6 JG1DKJ Mr. Sawada's Appointment as Executive Committee Chairperson

The reason I was able to overcome this difficult situation is entirely thanks to Mr. Kurakichi Sawada JG1DKJ, JARL Tokyo Branch Manager, who has been appointed as the Ham Fair Executive Committee Chairman. Mr. Sawada displayed great "manliness" by taking on the role of Executive Committee Chairman even though he had not taken over from his predecessor at all. He was kind enough to directly say to me, "Please introduce foreign attendees at the event corner just before the program Ham Fairs around the World."

This paved the way for introducing my Qatar's benefactor to Japanese hams.

7 A Strategy Meeting

It's unclear how many overseas participants will be attending the event corner to attend the program "Ham Fairs around the World." And I thought A75GM Kumar would be the only one for my introduction on stage. Then, in mid-August just before Ham Fair, I received an email from W0TT Eric informing me that he would be participating in the Ham Fair in Tokyo.

I praised Eric, saying, "You have just sent an e-mail to the most suitable person in Japan regarding your participation in Ham Fair," and asked him to contact JARL International Section, while also putting my carefully thought-out plan into action. My part would be just before JA1SLS Mr. Tamama's presentation "Ham Fairs around the World." So, my scenario was as follows:

- 1 I would introduce the visiting overseas stations.
- 2 Simple greetings by the representatives, touching Hamvention in the United States and Ham Radio in Germany

I had thought of this scenario in which my part would be the intro and prologue to Mr. Tamama's presentation. The next step is how to realize it.

The cooperation of Kumar and Eric was essential to making this plan a reality. I picked up Kumar at the hotel closest to Tokyo Big Sight, celebrated our reunion at Hilton Tokyo where Eric was staying, and held a strategy meeting. It was my first time at <u>Marvel Lounge</u>, a buffet restaurant at Hilton Tokyo, and I really liked it. Next time I'd like to wear a jacket and look stylish.

I could translate their greetings consecutively, but it would be easier for the audience to understand and smarter when their Japanese translation would be displayed on MS-PowerPoint slides projected on the screen at the site. Therefore, I explained "I would take two gentlemen to the podium. As the representatives of the attending overseas participants, I would like you to read my drafts of your greetings." Very fortunately, they readily agreed to my proposal.

8 The Day of Ham Fair (August 19, 2023)

As promised, Kumar and Eric came to Ariake Washington Hotel at 9 a.m.

On the day of the event, I entered Tokyo Big Sight with my ID at 7:30 a.m. before it opened as a JARL staff member. And at 08:00 as soon as it opened, I welcomed those wishing to operate 8J1HAM, the commemorative event station for Ham Fair. According to the South Building access way on the website, you will have to walk endlessly on the first floor and then go up a long escalator there. But there is another method that is open to the public. If you make your way through the rooftop parking lot of the south building, you will arrive at the entrance closest to South Hall 3. This may not always be possible, as long as the parking lot entrance is open, but if the Ham Fair is held in the south wing, this is a smart way.

The JARL side had not informed the MC that I would be on stage, so I told her in detail that next corner would be made up of 2 parts, "Introduction of Foreign Attendees" and "Ham Fair around the World," and that I would be the presenter of the first half. While explaining, I suppressed my excitement and set up my PC.

More than 10 entities participated in this Ham Fair. For my presentation, "Introduction of Foreign Attendees," I first introduced the visiting overseas stations who came to the event corner, and since it was not possible for them all to greet, as representatives, Kumar and Eric greeted.

As I wrote first, my prologue was as follows: "In November 2022, I stayed in the capital Doha as a supporter of the Japanese National Team of Football during FIFA World Cup in Qatar, and became an eyewitness and on-site witness to the triumphs over Germany and Spain. At the same time, it was the days of operating A722FWC at QARS. Without wearing a mask, the days continued like a dream."

In 2026, while supporting the Japan National Team of Football in the United States, I am looking forward to operating my dream <u>W1AW</u> and visiting W0TT Eric's shack in Missouri to rekindle our old friendships.



From the hearth with pain radio amateur radio.


